NOTES ON COMPLETION OF FORM H1-OMC

These notes should be read in conjunction with the relevant legislation.

General

This form must be completed correctly, in full and in accordance with the following notes. Every section of the form must be completed.

Where "not applicable", "nil" or "none" is appropriate, please state.

note one

All outstanding annual returns of the company, if any, must be submitted with Form H1-OMC. A company, including an Owners' Management Company, cannot be restored to the register unless all outstanding annual returns have been delivered to CRO in respect of that company. Note that although the Form H1-OMC may be signed by a member of an OMC, it is necessary for each annual return of the OMC to be signed by a director and the secretary of the company and for the financial statements annexed to each return to be certified by two of its directors.

note two

Application must be made within **six years** of the date of dissolution. Form H1-OMC must be lodged not later than the **day before** the sixth anniversary of the company's dissolution. Administrative restoration of an owners' management company is not possible if more than 6 years have elapsed since the date of the company's dissolution. The company's date of dissolution may be ascertained using the company search facility on www.cro.ie.

note three

The company cannot be restored to the register unless the accountant's/solicitor's certificate accompanies this form, as well as the certified copy of the deed of transfer of the common areas or a part thereof in respect of the multi-unit development in relation to which the company was incorporated. "Certified copy" means a copy of the deed of transfer that has been certified by a solicitor as a true copy of the original deed.

note four

Tick the relevant box(es). This form **must** be certified by a current officer or member of the company.

Further information

An Owner's Management Company is defined as a company established for the purposes of becoming the owner of the common areas of a multi-unit development and the management, maintenance and repair of such areas and which is a company registered under the Companies Act. See Section 1 Multi-Unit Developments Act 2011.

Where the restoration application is within the first 12 months of the date of dissolution, the company could alternatively file Form H1 and use the restoration process available under Chapter 2 of Part 12 of the Companies Act 2014.

Payment

If paying by cheque, postal order or bank draft, please make the fee payable to the Companies Registration Office. Cheques or bank drafts must be drawn on a bank in the Republic of Ireland.

A Form H1-OMC that is not completed correctly or is not accompanied by the correct fee is liable to be rejected and returned to the presenter by the CRO pursuant to section 898 Companies Act 2014. Unless the document, duly corrected, is relodged in the CRO within 14 days, it will be deemed to have never been delivered to the CRO.
